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#### A Note from MIA KATIGBAK

Dear Theatergoer:

Hansol Jung's modern verse translation of William Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet is breathtaking, and I fell in love with the play the first time I did a reading of it for Play On Shakespeare in 2019. NAATCO brought it to Two River Theater in Red Bank, NJ for its world premiere and it fills me with distinct pleasure and pride that NAATCO has transferred it to New York.

Hansol gives this most familiar and popular of Shakespeare's plays, considered by many the greatest of love stories, a masterful reiteration: vibrant, athletic, lyrical, revelatory. And it is just so much fun – until its tragic end, when ecstatic, full-hearted, all-encompassing and unbridled love is extinguished by a senseless "ancient grudge," reignited by civil brawls "bred of some empty words."

The perpetuation of rivalries through the ages, even when the cause can no longer be remembered, or is no longer relevant, continues to plague our society. It plagues our ability to understand each other. It stands in the way of our going beyond what we know so that we can revel in what is different. It deters us from finding peace, from bringing us to different planes of discovery and delight.

Hansol's adaptation immediately posits the circumstance of reluctant quarrel. Members of the rival houses know they are rivals, know that they're supposed to behave as rivals do, but don't really want to fight. Comedy ensues as an accidental brawl erupts, interrupted by the Prince, who reminds us that even a long peace is fragile in the face of "rusty hate." The duality between what is known versus what is felt, between civility and animal instinct drives the comic engine in the play until Mercutio's death, when the ancient grudge reasserts itself and demands hewing to the rules and regulations that enforce the rivalry, resulting in the tragic loss of the lovers' lives.

The Prologue tells us the story straightaway. We all know what happens before Act I begins. The Prince asks us at the end of the play to think more on the tragedy we've just witnessed. To "have more talk about these sad things," to talk about how, by allowing continuous animosity and hate to govern our lives, "all are punished."

NAATCO has always maintained that new insights about old plays can come from new faces. Asian Americans have always had limited access to working on European classics unless we "Asianize" them. In partnership with Two River Theater, and with the generous support of Play On Shakespeare, an all-Asian American cast presents an age-old story from new perspectives, with heartfelt glee and earnest soul. I hope you are moved. And tickled.
